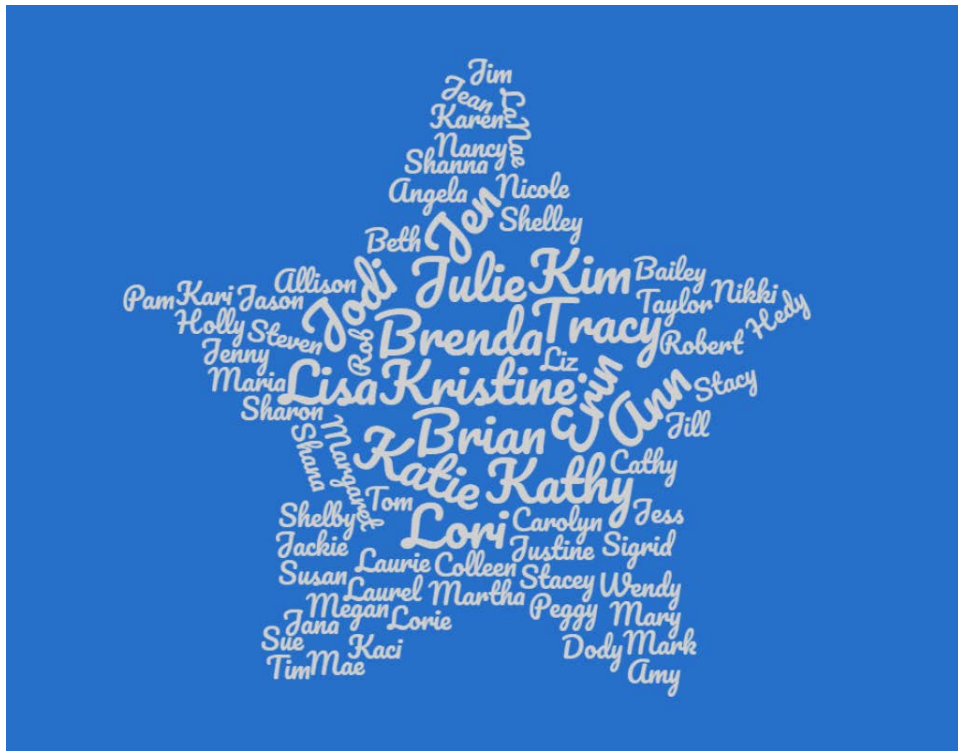


2018 Indicator 14 Survey

The Indicator 14 survey was conducted primarily June-September 2018 and included nine “Core” survey questions regarding participation in higher education, participation in other postsecondary education or training, participation in competitive employment, and participation in other types of employment. Exiters who were contacted had been out of school for a year either by graduating with a diploma, aged out, received a certificate of completion or dropped out. Approximately 1/5 of LEAs (public school districts and 2r Charters) are required to participate in the Indicator 14 data collection and reporting responsibilities as part of DPI's Collection of Cyclical Indicators. The remaining LEAs are invited to participate in the Wisconsin Indicator 14 Survey.

This year, 93 interviewers were trained and assigned to a district/school to conduct the Indicator 14 survey on behalf of the district. A special thank you to these interviewers who worked diligently over the summer and into September to complete these survey interviews. Participating in this survey window included: 357 districts with a total of 7,729 exiters, of which 3,952 surveys were successfully completed resulting in a 51.13% response rate statewide. Individual district response rates ranged from a low of 0% to 21 districts reaching a 100% response rate. The survey was a great success because of the hard work and dedication to the project from all of the people below.



The preliminary 2018 results indicate an increase to 31.43% of exiters participating in postsecondary education, up from 28.4% in 2017, 39.73% involved in competitive employment, 3.87% in other postsecondary education and 8.7% involved in other employment.
